3.0 – Officers' Reports

3.1 – President's Report – Meera Chander

- Continued to meet with Sexual Assault Committee
 - Making final touches for the job description of coordinator
 - Would coordinate Sexual Assault services
 - Hiring will begin in January
- There has been talk of enforcing a Code of Conduct on off-campus students
 - All three councils are against it
- Meeting with Ed Kane, Assistant Vice-President
- Also meeting with the president
- As for Abstentions, we had a locksmith come in to change the code on the safe
- The code has not been changed in 5 years, so it was about time
- We have a new cash register and a new inventory that counts everything that leaves the store – it is more efficient
- Bree's Inn – pool tables are being used, however there is little respect for the space itself
- We are trying to come up with a course of action for that
- Remote control problems should have been rectified, let me know if they haven't
- The issues we were discussing about the heating system happen, they can't be controlled
- The elevator at Prescott is being looked into. At least they know there's a problem

- The television in Frontenac is being installed, there were issues with the cable and bracket mounts

- Donnie Northrup (2nd Leeds)
 - First Aid training being offered

- 2nd Leeds

- Eli Cymet (3rd Frontenac)
 - Rez Fellow and I are thinking of pooling funds to do a group laser tag

 - We've been having lots of complaints on our floor about noise lasting till 3 or 4 in the morning on weeknights
 - I'm wondering if maybe Rez Security could walk the floors, as they're usually called there anyway
 - Meera – Ya, I'll put that in the report, you're definitely the first floor to ask that
- Amanda (3rd Stormont)
 - I've had complaints from those who are opposite the fishbowl
 - They're being woken up at 5 by the Garbage trucks, they make way too much noise
 - This has been a consistent complaint
 - Garrett Elsey (2nd Renfrew) – same problem for street side of Renfrew
- Allison Render (7th Frontenac)
 - One elevator in our building stops at the 5th floor
 - This is very annoying
 - Can it be fixed?
 - Meera – I'll check it out
- Brendan Jones (1st Lanark)
 - We have no storage
 - Someone had their \$1000 hockey pads stolen as a result
- Natalie Cantin (8th Glengarry)
 - 7th Glengarry has a vending machine on their floor
 - My floor thinks we need a vending machine too
 - All the other floors in all the other residences have one
 - James – Abstentions is open 24 hours
 - I will go around and unplug all the other vending machines
- Jolisa Robinson (1st Leeds)
 - Our TV lounge is kind of in the basement
 - We have five windows and only two curtains
 - Our floor is made up of lots of girls, and at night it can get kind of creepy
 - We'd like to have more curtains installed
- John Hayes (2nd Prescott)
 - Our windows are floor to ceiling
 - There are no curtains

- Sarah Hewey (10th Glengarry)
 - Our microwave is rubbish
 - Shuts off in the middle of making things
 - Dies for whole nights at a time

 - Meera
 - For all of these problems, make sure you have filled out a work order first
 - When I go to Housing with all these issues and they ask me if the proper orders have been filled out, if I say, “I don’t know,” I don’t come off looking so good
 - If you’ve filled one out and it’s still an issue, come to the committee meetings or send me an email

 - Lindsay Gerus (2nd Frontenac)
 - People’s fuses in their kitchens are blowing
 - Rez security doesn’t have the keys to the boxes
 - We go whole weekends without anything working

 - Ariel Norman (3rd Dundas)
 - 2nd Dundas has a floor outside where you can call to be let in
 - No other floor has one
 - Meera – That’s actually because of me
 - We used to have creepy people come onto our floor
 - That phone was added so we could stop it
 - It was put on the 2nd floor as it is the main one, but if you want one too, we can look into that

 - Deanna Bralten (1st Stormont)
 - I’m issuing a challenge to floors from Stormont/Dundas to a Rockband competition
 - Each floor would make up a band
 - Kailey – Would you like this to be done through Floor of the Year?
– Yes
 - Renfrew accepts as well

7.0 – Question Period

- Garret Elsey (2nd Renfrew)
 - This is a question regarding bringing back football, what about men’s rugby?
 - We don’t actually have a men’s rugby team on campus, and many have asked me about it
 - Cameron – This is a good question. There is the possibility of starting it as a club.

- Deferred to Kailey – I was part of the group that spoke on these cuts
 - Lots of clubs like golf and swimming were cut because of budget cuts
 - Men’s rugby was never a varsity team
 - I would suggest contacting Chris Surgeoner, you can find his email through the Athletics website

- Manal Demaghltrous (4th Frontenac)
 - About Drop the Fees, the Engineering Faculty has pulled support, so if we miss class, we could get in trouble.
 - James – There is system academic accommodation for this event, you cannot be penalized for missing class. If your prof really thinks hindering free speech is a good idea, let us know and we’ll see to things on your behalf
 - Manal – The problem is that there’s a lab that day.
 - James – Labs are hard to reschedule. Have you spoken to your prof?
 - Donnie Northrup (2nd Leeds) – You can’t move the whole lab, but you may be able to reschedule it to another lab section. If you are anyone else has this problem, try to accommodate it and move the lab to another day. Talk to your prof.

- Geoff Plint (4th Renfrew)
 - I’m just wondering why Remembrance Day is not a holiday here?
 - Why don’t students have this day off so we can go downtown for to the monument? If we want to do that, why do we have to miss class?
 - I’m from BC, so for the past 18 years I have had this day off
 - James – the reason that this day is no longer a holiday is that students were using it for less productive means
 - Cameron – It really depends on the university. York has changed their holiday schedule again. Unfortunately, Jewish holidays were canceled.
 - Meera – I have that meeting scheduled with the president, maybe I can bring that up

- Krystina Martinez (3rd Dundas)
 - I have another question about academic accommodation. What is it actually defined as? Let’s say I have a paper due that day?
 - James – While you are at this event, you cannot be penalized for being absent from class during the time frame. In terms of papers, if there’s a drop box then it’s fine, because you do not have to be there at that time.
 - Michael – Does that include the time to and from the event?

- We looked at the budget and it was passed unanimously
- Hopefully the same can happen here today

 - For those of you who are new to council, this is how the motioning is going to work:
 - First we will hear the motion,
 - It will be moved and seconded
 - There will be time to address any questions you might have about the motion
 - We will debate about the motion
 - And finally the motion will be put to a vote

9.0 – Motion to Adopt the RRRRA Budget for 2008 - 2009

- Moved by Meera
- Seconded by Cameron
- Meera
 - Ok, so there are quite a few things that need to be covered
 - I'm going to highlight important things to know and then questions can be asked afterwards
 - So, the budget has been formatted differently this year
 - The reason for this was that it was not done properly in the past
 - We decided that proper practices should be used, as the old budget was completely inaccurate
 - It now follows the academic year and the summer
 - It's easier to understand, and a lot more detailed
 - You will now know exactly where the money is going – Same idea as with the new constitution
 - With these numbers, we have not accounted for the new building – we don't know how much will be spent in terms of the store – More cons in that sense
 - Last year we had a whole lot of formal errors, taking action to stop them
 - Now, we'll take a look at the second page
 - RRRRA Administration found that we were missing \$100 dollars from the Cash Register
 - We have no idea where it went
 - We've gotten rid of the Residence Issues Coordinator Position
 - Lots of what they did is part of my job
 - We're allocating more money (\$4000) to RRRRA Scholarships
 - As for the Executive Retreat, there was no retreat this year
 - The VPA Special Projects (\$1500) is the Bike Share Program's funding
 - Miscellaneous Unaudited by the RRRRA Administration
 - That was a printer that we thought we were leasing, ended up having to buy (\$15 195.23)
 - If you look to the Charlatan delivery, the contract was pulled out
 - It was felt that floor reps weren't picking up the papers, and was seen as unnecessary

- We tried to fight it, but we lost
- Now, turning to the third page, you'll see Abstentions' Expenses
- We got rid of movie rentals, we ended up paying for missing ones at the end of the year last year
- Managers' salary wages have gone up
- The cash register was \$432 unaudited, now \$6500 for the new system
- With more students comes a bigger variety of products (mugs, lanyards, etc.)
- Increase in promotional materials
- Kailey – Battle of the Bands through CUSA
 - We're trying to get more people involved instead of having just the one headliner

Questions:

- Question about the money under “Floor Rep Training.” What was that \$500 for?
 - Cameron – It went towards food, the binders, we rented a Wii and games, also towards pizza

Debate:

- Tim Rose (4th Leeds)
 - Speaking for this motion
 - I have been to the financial committee and overseen many projects
 - This is arguably the most thorough and well put-together budget I have ever seen
 - It obviously needs to go through

Vote:

- Put forward by Meera
- All in favour, none opposed

10.0 – Motion to add the Carleton Academic Student Government (CASG) seat to RRRA Council

- Moved by Eli Cymet (3rd Frontenac)
- Seconded by Sarah Hewey (10th Glengarry)
- Eli Cymet (3rd Frontenac)
 - I am a student on CSG from the Film Department
 - Students should be concerned both with what goes on in rez and in their academic departments
 - I think that CSG having a seat on RRRA is a reasonable idea and would be beneficial
 - In terms of how long this meeting would go CSG had a seat, GRC never shows up

- Also, CSG presences would be non-voting
 - It would strictly be to keep council up to date with what is happening in each department
 - We could get a unique rez perspective
 - It's concerning all students, so everyone should be for
 - It would be beneficial to both councils and would increase cooperation
- Eli Cymet (3rd Frontenac)
- Permission to motion to Andrew Monkhouse to speak
 - Seconded by Cameron
 - Motion is supported by two thirds in favour
- Andrew Monkhouse
- Eli motivated our position very well
 - I'm just going to add a couple of points
 - I was also the President of CSG last year
 - I came out to every RRRRA meeting or sent the Vice President
 - Steph Winston would also come as Vice External
 - So we've had a long history of coming to these meetings
 - There are lots of issues that the two groups share
 - For example, last year when Frontenac was being renovated, it was very noisy, so we moved a motion to Senate to limit the time of construction so students could sleep/study
 - Last year, in the last council meeting, a seat was added for us
 - However, the amendment was changed, the constitution was rewritten, and, hopefully due to a mistake, the seat was gone
 - CSG is not asking for a voting seat, just for the ability to speak and to answer questions
 - Each residence is filled with students with academic concerns
 - Especially looking to help first years
 - Also, RRRRA is important as it serves as a good transition for students looking to be a part of CSG
 - We have twelve representatives from RRRRA now on council
 - I do not know the reasoning for CSG not having a seat here
 - There is no disadvantage
 - It's a minor issue, but it means a lot
 - Grant us this minor issue
 - RRRRA has a seat at CSG
 - Please, strongly consider

Questions:

- Victor Ryan (9th Glengarry)
- The fact that CSG was not included in the Constitution, was that just an oversight?

- Cameron – It was not an oversight, but we'll address the reasons why in debate
- Donnie Northrup (2nd Leeds)
 - I'm just wondering, does CSG have access to Carleton Connect accounts?
 - Andrew Monkhouse – Not sure what the relevance of the question is, but yes we have the ability to email every student, alumni as well. Emails tend to get a tad annoying, but we can send them

Debate:

- Meera
 - Speaking against this motion
 - First of all, as an executive, I worked on the Constitution this summer
 - We tried to approve accountability, for example, how much money the executives make, etc.
 - CSG's seat on council was not overlooked
 - It was not included because, before they existed, we had New University Government, and they did not have a seat on council either
 - Motion was brought forward last year, and yes, it was passed
 - However, it was omnibus, which means that it was piled with a bunch of other motions and brought before council
 - All are passed out, and that's how it was approved on
 - CSG should not have a seat, the meetings will go too long
 - There's no need for them to have a seat as they do not deal with residence issues, but academic issues
 - Cameron sits on Senate as does Donnie, and I sit on the CSG
 - We have explained that if our seat does need to be removed from CSG, that's fine with us
 - You will have noticed how late the meeting went last week
 - It went till 11:30, so imagine how late it would go if there was an additional report
 - CSG has no relevance to this council and will only add time constraints
- Tim Rose (4th Leeds)
 - Speaking against this motion
 - I don't want to limit the ability to speak, but this would not be the only way they could address council
 - CSG has the ability to use Announcements and Correspondence time, as they did today
 - They don't need a seat on council if they can speak anyway
- Manal Demaghatrous (4th Frontenac)
 - Speaking against this motion
 - These meetings last long enough

- If CSG needs to address council they can do it during Announcements, or they can send out emails
- If students really need to contact them, they can email as well
- CSG can address enough people without having a seat on council

➤ Cameron

- Speaking against this motion
- We looked at the Constitution this summer in order to start over
- We looked at the history of RRRA since 1968
- We also looked at the New University Government, and they were never a part of RRRA
- Yes, they should be allowed to speak in Announcements, but they do not need a seat on council
- The motion was only passed at the last meeting because it was omnibused
- We have no issue with having people speak in Announcements
- So CASG has that time to address council
- Giving them an actual seat doesn't make sense
- If you are wondering why CUSA has a seat, we've worked closely with them throughout the year such as with Frosh
- As for GRC, hopefully they will start coming out more
- We're working under a different capacity
- Academic issues are great and important to consider
- However they do not fit on this council, and I do not think a seat for them is needed
- I was a part of the New University Government in 2006
- CASG has a purpose, just not on this council

➤ Krystina Martinez (3rd Dundas)

- Speaking against this motion
- It's already 10:30
- These meetings last long enough
- They make us stay up late when we could be working on assignments

➤ Eli Cymet (3rd Frontenac)

- Speaking for the motion
- In regards to the time issue, that an excess would be used for CSG, it was specifically said that we are not looking for a report
- I don't really see how someone sitting down would add excess time to the meeting
- The core of this debate has been that it would make us stay later
- We ran campaigns in order to be able to represent our floors
- It is our responsibility to inform our floors about what is going on
- About the idea of CSG sending out emails through Carleton Connect, I may be the only one, but I often simply dismiss Connect Emails
- To have CSG limited to sending out emails would be detrimental

- Sarah Hewey (10th Glengarry)
 - Speaking against the motion
 - It's true we did run to represent our floors, but we also have lives outside of these meetings
- Geoff Plint (4th Renfrew)
 - Speaking for this motion
 - This meeting started nearly 20 minutes late, and the last meeting started late as well
 - If we use our time productively, we can save more time
 - It's just generally about respect
 - First years may not necessarily know academic ways
 - CSG could offer assistance with these matters
- Sofie Timkovski (5th Frontenac)
 - Speaking against this motion
 - The primary reason that we are here is to gain an education
 - We don't have two hours to spare for these meetings when we need to be doing work
 - I think it should be enough for CSG to speak during Announcements
- Donnie Northrup (2nd Leeds)
 - Speaking against this motion
 - If CSG is able to give a report, then it has to open up for questioning also
 - We all experienced the exhausting process at the last meeting
 - If CSG has a seat, it will be potentially very time consuming
 - Also, if they gain a seat, we will only see Andrew or one other specific individual
